

The Devereux Early Childhood Assessment (DECA) Program

- Based on resilience theory, the DECA program is a mental health promotion, primary prevention, and early intervention system
- Fosters partnerships between parents, teachers and, when necessary, mental health professionals
- Evidence-based
- Enhances, not replaces, other curricula


The Devereux Early Childhood Assessment (DECA)

- Core of the DECA program
- Nationally normed (US), standardized measure of within-child protective factors in children ages 2-5
- Assesses three protective factors
 - Initiative
 - Self-Control
 - Attachment
- Screens for behavioral concerns



The Devereux Early Childhood Assessment (DECA) cont.

- Meets professional standards for assessments
- Brief 37 items, 5-8 minutes to complete
- English and Spanish
- Computerized administration and scoring available
- Assessment results lead directly to classroom and home strategies to promote resilience



Promoting Partnerships with Families

- Both parents and teachers complete the DECA
 On individual child profile, parents come first
- Rater comparison provides a statistically sound, easy technique to achieve a better understanding of the child's behavior across environments and with different adults
- Based on the standard error of the difference
- Can compare each scale as well as the total

DECA & Parent-Professional Collaboration Summary

- Strength-based approach is a better basis for collaboration than deficit approaches
- DECA provides a sound, easy to use technique to compare the parent and teachers perceptions.
- Comparisons can be made at the individual scale level
- Tools are designed to reinforce the primacy of the parent.
- Most importantly, results support collaborative planning to support the child.
